



Sports Funding 2015-16

The Government is providing additional funding to improve the provision of PE and sport in primary schools. This funding is ring-fenced and so can only be spent on PE and sport.

At Heworth we expect to receive approximately £8387 for 2015-2016. This is to benefit every child in the school. We currently have 141 children on roll.

For the academic year 2015-16 we will continue to use the funding to engage the services of qualified sports coaches or PE Subject Leader to teach one PE lesson per week to 100% of our classes. Our providers are Total Sports Ltd (www.totalsportslimited.co.uk) who have an excellent reputation within York.

Every class teacher will continue to teach one PE lesson per week in addition to the 'Total Sports' taught lesson (or PE subject leader). Teachers will benefit from training, advice and support from the specialist coaches which will increase capacity and the skills of our own staff.

In addition, a sports coach will provide an after school club, which will vary throughout the year in line with children's interests. Different age groups will be given the opportunity to take part in varied activities over the year. Class teachers and support staff will also continue to provide their own extra-curricular sporting activities.

Details of spending

In 2015-16, we were allocated £8387

We are spending part of the money on:

- Membership of the York School Sports Network level 1. This provides us with access to local competitions and sports leagues.
- Coaching from Yorkshire Cricket Club.
- Coaching from the York City Knights rugby league club.
- Membership of Heworth Tennis club in order to use their new refurbished all weather tennis courts.
- Coaching from Heworth Tennis Club.
- Employing support staff to lead after school sports clubs.
- The hire of the local Church Hall for indoor PE.

Extra-Curricular Activities

Through this funding we have also increased provision for and uptake of sports clubs. We have increased the number of spaces at clubs.

Sports clubs on offer during the year:

- Football (mixed)
- Football (girls)
- Hockey
- Cricket
- Tag Rugby
- Total fitness
- Netball

These are subsidised by use of the Sports Premium, so that children can access them at a reduced cost.

Competitive Sport

In 2015/16 we will be taking part in football, hockey, netball, girls' football, cricket and tag rugby tournaments, leagues and cup competitions locally.
